Sometimes we can get a bit messy...(reading this just might save you money!)

Though we try to keep clean, creating can sometimes be a messy affair - accidents such as paint spills will happen. I would like to ask that each student have their own smock that will be kept in their classroom. A large button down shirt works very well. An extra step is to cut off the neck/collar so that your student can simply pull it over their head without buttoning and unbuttoning. Cutting the sleeves to a proper length for your student is especially helpful as well. Please do not send plastic smocks (especially the ones that tie at the sides and do not cover sleeves). Art day may not be a good day to wear that new outfit or treasured shirt! Thank you for making sure your student has his/her own art smock no later than Monday, September 17th – we are going to get busy quickly!

Making art not suds...

Our art studio will be busy and we want to spend most of class creating our masterpieces. A classroom full of students at the sink takes precious time and is quite a sight! 4th and 5th grade students will be saving their projects in a student portfolio instead of work coming home periodically throughout the year. The art portfolio provides student reflection on self-progress and learning as well as projects getting home in good condition. K-3rd grade students will typically bring home projects a few weeks after completion unless the work is on display. *Please be assured that all artwork eventually does come home!*

4th and 5th graders will keep "class-made" sketchbooks in the art studio. We will use them for working out ideas for projects, drawing exercises, bright ideas, and extra moments. If your student expresses an interest in having one at home, they can be purchased relatively inexpensively at any arts and crafts store. (Or homemade ones can be extra special too!)
